	Biblical Convictions	Biblical Persuasions	Biblical Opinions
Nature of Belief	Non-negotiables in the Scriptures; Christians around the world and throughout history.	Options within biblical parameters; the basis for many denominations.	Variable based on Scripture and according to conscience.
How Scripture Informs Them	Main themes and assertions of the Bible; foundational truths of Christianity	Supported by fewer passages of Scripture; or only indirectly addressed by Scripture; peripheral issues.	Matters of application or interpretation of Scripture
Relating to People who believe differently	Be willing to be persecuted for these truths; be willing to break Christian fellowship over these truths	Be free to express views, but to treat those who differ with respect; seek to understand other viewpoints	Speak tentatively and with humility; Talk about your opinions rather than "the Bible says"
